A: More updates-CES is working on multitude of things. The recommendation is looking at revising VI-SPDAT or create a new tool, or possibly using VI-SPDAT 3.0, staff from state will be attending CES committee meeting to discuss. More to come.

Was agreed to not score the NOVA this year, after hearing from a lot of other communities that are doing round 2 of YHDP. Not holding scores accountable, with ranking. Makings sure that funds support young people. Board might not have to do any voting on it at this time.

Chat: not all youth are ready for independent living

We need some supportive communal living options for those who need to develop some of the basic skills to work toward independence.

RRH is somewhat geared towards housing first model. Not having that middle ground has created some barriers.

Some youth are not ready to be housed. Working on better preparing youth to be better renters.

We will be working on this with grantees more. Will have a region wide kick off meeting, needing to see what agencies, people should be there for the kick off meeting.
